Lorin Cartwright, retired athletic trainer and director at Ann Arbor Pioneer. Helped set up Skyline's athletic program as well. She has written and published 6 books. She has been active in implementing Title 9.

Title IX is an educational rule: No person in the U.S. shall be denied based on their gender in education.

Student athletes are awesome! Here's why:

- Student athletes excel in business areas.
 - They get better grades in school.
 - They stay away from drugs and alcohol.
- Helps stave away heart disease, diabetes, etc. Obesity is an

epidemic in the U.S. for high schoolers. It has tripled in the last 20 years. Detroit metro is the 3 largest area.

What is the three-prong test for the Athletic program?

- Providing athletic participation of opportunities that are proportionate to student enrollment,
- Demonstrate continual expansion of opportunities in underrepresented sex or Full and effective accommodation of the interest and ability of underrepresented sex.

Is Title IX still needed?

- Women make 77 cents on the dollar.
 - Natural science women earned 15% less pay.
 - Female college athletes get 37% of total money spent in athletics.
 - \$14K more is spent on male athletes than females in college
- 58% of college expenses are in football at division I.

President Mark would like to fill the position no later than January 20, 2013. Contact Mark to express interest in this position.



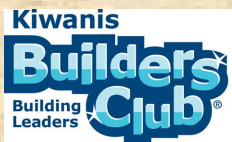
